SUBJECT: Legislative Update

Ladies and Gentlemen,

As reported in June, the 86<sup>th</sup> regular session of the Texas Legislature concluded on May 27, 2019. At this time there is still no indication the Governor will call a special session. As of the June report there were two bills we had been tracking that passed but were still awaiting Governor signature. Those bills have both been signed by the Governor and are listed below.

## Since last report the following bills we closely monitored have final action to report:

SB 322 by Huffman, relating to the evaluation and reporting of investment practices and performance of certain pubic retirement systems. This has a lot of oversight, evaluation, and reporting requirements for the systems.

This bill passed the Senate on a vote of 31 years and 0 nays. It also passed the House with a vote of 144 years and 0 nays and 2 present not voting. This bill primarily deals with investment practices and performance reports required of a public retirement system. It was sent to the Governor on 5-25-2019 and was signed on 6-10-2019. This bill takes effect immediately.

## **Bills Not Related to State Pensions:**

<u>HB 1552 By Paul,</u> relating to the weapons proficiency of and the carrying of a handgun by qualified retired law enforcement officers. This is a cleanup of Texas Statute to lineup with federal LEOSA statute.

This bill was passed by the House on local and consent calendar and passed by the Senate on local and uncontested calendar. It was sent to the Governor on 5-29-2019 and was signed on 6-14-2019. This bill takes effect on 9-1-2019.
