

Storm Services Engineering [www.stormSL.com] is actively seeking individuals in the Dallas/Fort Worth area to perform Wire Guard duties when we are contracted to support restoration work after storm events. Specifically, the job is to deploy to the specified area where you will be dispatched to downed utility wires, broken poles, or other hazards, and secure the area to safely prevent the public from entering. You would not be required to handle the equipment in any manner. You will simply keep others clear from the area until a representative from the utility company arrives on the site.

- **Why you?** We know that former law enforcement officers are disciplined, professional, and have in-depth experience and training serving the public and securing potentially dangerous areas.
- **Why Storm Services Engineering?** Our company has built a strong reputation among electric utilities all across the nation. We have supported their restoration efforts for multiple storms including hurricanes Ivan, Ike, Rita, Sandy, Florence, and Michael and most recently, Hurricane Barry. Last year alone, Storm Services worked for utilities in over 50 storm events across the country.
- **Is there any training?** We have developed a three-part online training to familiarize you with the equipment and situations that you will encounter. The training is industry comprehensive and will provide information for greater safety awareness. Again, you will always keep yourself clear of the equipment and never have to handle the equipment.
- **Where may you be asked to work?** We are seeking to increase our numbers in the Dallas-Fort Worth area for events in the Texas/Arkansas region. Typical events include wind storms, ice/snow events, and even large scale hurricanes. It is possible that you may be interested in working other areas also.
- **How long is the usual deployment?** Depending on the scope of an event, our deployments are anywhere from two days to three weeks. For example, it is not uncommon for a utility to prepare for an event, bring us on board, and because the impact of the storm was less than expected, we are released in a couple of days. Conversely, last year's winter snow storms, Quinn, Riley, Schuyler, and Toby, kept us busy for over two weeks. Please note, we work long hours depending on our client's needs.
- **How will you be identified in the field as being a storm contractor for Storm Services Engineering?** When deployed you will be issued a storm duffel bag including a hard hat, hi-visibility safety vest, a vehicle beacon light, Storm Services signage for your vehicle, barrier ribbon, and other necessary PPE.
- **What about pay?** Paid hours include mobilization and demobilization, stand-by, on-site and, of course, time in the field. During deployment, Storm Services will provide fuel for your vehicle and the host utility will provide food and lodging.
